

Country/Blues Rhythm Lick!

This is a good lick to use when you are playing rhythm guitar on a country/blues song. Use the exact same lick when you're going to the IV and V chord. It's a nice tool if you are backing up a singer by yourself with your acoustic guitar, or if you're playing in a band situation. Good Luck!
